

SEALS AND LAFRAMBOISE SET TEAM RECORDS IN 11-3 ROUT OF VANCOUVER!

OAKLAND — In their first game of the new year, the Seals engineered a win that was impressive over a team that in three previous meetings this season had defeated the Seals in each game by no more than a simple one goal margin. On January 3 the Seals hosted the Vancouver Canucks on home ice for the first time this season, and the Canucks and their coach Vic Stasiuk will not forget the Seals' stunning 11-3 triumph very soon.

Another person who won't ever forget the game is the Seals' rookie left winger Pete Laframboise, who powered in four goals in that game. In the entire Seals NHL history, no player has ever scored four goals in a game for our club. So Laframboise, who was an All-Star in the AHL last year and once had a four goal game with Baltimore (AHL), now finds himself in the Seals record books. Immediately after the game, Pete also found himself \$400 richer as Seals' President Charles O. Finley personally handed him a roll of 20 crisp \$20 bills for his record setting performance.

The Seals won't forget that victory soon either. For the results of that game will now become a part of the Seals Team Record Books, too.

Here are the records set by the Seals in that one spectacular 11-3 game:

- Most goals, one game by a Seals' Player: Pete Laframboise 4
- Most goals, one game by the Seals' team 11
- Most goals, one period by the Seals' team (3rd period) 6
- Largest winning margin 8 goals
- Fastest five Seals' goals:
 - 11 min., 39 sec. (elapsed time)
- Fastest six Seals' goals:
 - 12 min., 40 sec. (elapsed time)

All we can say is that it was one heck of a game, and the records bear us out!!!
