# KC Scouts A Mystery To Seals

After a disappointing 0-4-1 swing to the East the Seals are on home ice tonight against the new Kansas City Scouts, a team that has yet to play before a home crowd.

The Seals admittedly know little of their 8 p.m. Coliseum Arena rivals. Starting goalie Gilles Meloche, who likes to know the opposition so he will know their shooting habits, asked a reporter who the Scouts have.
